Happy Hikers at Raptor Ridge on October 5 by Gayle Ziaskas

This is a great hike just minutes north of Rancho Bernardo and east of I-15 off Highland Valley Rd. The hike is about 4.2-miles round-trip. This is a moderate 2-hour hike starting out flat where we join the Coast to Crest Trail. The second half gains elevation to reach gorgeous views of San Pasqual Valley. The trailhead is located 2.2 miles up Highland Valley Rd where there is a large sign with the address 14225 Highland Valley Road and Evergreen Nursery. Take a right into the parking lot where we will assemble. We will start hiking at 8:30 a.m.

If you wish to carpool, meet at the Rancho Bernardo Transit center on West Bernardo Road at 8:15 a.m. From there, drive north on West Bernardo Rd, crossing over I-15, and turn left at the first light onto Highland Valley Rd.

In November 2018, we sent out an every-member electronic survey. This survey listed the priorities and asked members to agree with the current statements or to offer suggestions for changes. 526 members completed the survey. The majority of the participants indicated agreement with the current priorities. A number of members provided comments and made suggestions for specific changes.
