#### Tech Trek Update by Heidi Dalvie

The Tech Trek Team, Aresa Toukdarian, Ellen Dillon and Heidi Dalvie, have selected eight girls from three Poway-Penasquitos Middle Schools to attend the week-long Tech Trek camp at UCSD this summer. This one-week, academic, residential camp immerses these seventh grade students (soon to be eighth graders) in Science, Engineering, Technology and Math classes and activities on campus. Girls will learn about careers from women employed in STEM fields and participate in many hands-on activities. Many AAUW volunteers make this camp possible including the dorm Moms. Janice Heather from our branch will be volunteering as a dorm mom this year.

The girls that were chosen are Arina Khalil and Anika Seth from Black Mountain Middle School, Jade Lee and Haven Teudt from Mesa Verde Middle School, and Natalie Calvario, Saysha Love, Tyra Neptune-Lucas and Oriana Castillo from Meadowbrook Middle School.

There are several ways to volunteer and get involved with the camp this year, which takes place at UCSD from June 23-29. The camp needs AAUW members to help with registration of campers on Sunday, June 23<sup>rd</sup> from about Noon-3:00 p.m. They are also in need of volunteers each day from 8-11:00 a.m. to be the second "adult" in the classroom so the dorm moms can attend the morning staff meeting and get a break. The volunteers would be in the classroom with the 16 students and the teacher. The volunteers are welcome to join the campers for lunch afterwards

AAUW members can also visit the camp. Visiting days are usually on Thursday and Friday of that week. Members try to go as a group as it makes it easier on the camp staff. ## Public Policy – The Status of Women and Girls in CA ~ 2019 by State Public Policy committee member, Ginny Hatfield

For the past eight years Mt. St. Mary's University in Los Angeles (the only all-women's higher educational institution in the area) has published a report assessing the status of women and girls in the state of California. This year's report entitled, *Intersections: Identity, Access and Equity*, "...celebrates the gains women have made and the challenges they continue to confront in areas like economic well-being, health and wellness, workforce factors and safety." It presents an overview of how women of different races and ethnicities are faring in CA. The following bills passed during the last legislative session were significant in making strides toward greater equity for California's women and girls; you may recognize some of them.\*

**BOARD OF DIRECTORS**: Mandates a baseline representation of female identified persons on the board of directors of each publicly held corporation whose principal executive offices are in California. (SENATE BILL 826, JACKSON)

**DISCLOSURE OF SALARY HISTORY**: Prohibits employers from seeking salary history information and making a subsequent salary determination for applicants, thereby improving pay equity. (ASSEMBLY BILL 168, EGGMAN)

**LACTATION ACCOMMODATION**: Requires employers to designate an area close to the workspace — excluding bathrooms — for employees who wish to express breast milk. (ASSEMBLY BILL 1976, LIMÓN)

**MARRIAGE AND DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP: MINORS**: Ensures additional levels of protection before a youth may marry or establish a domestic partnership by 1) providing information about their rights of termination and dissolution directly to children and 2) requiring involved parties to participate in premarital counseling. (SENATE BILL 273, HILL)

**EXTORTION**: Expands the crime of extortion to include consideration of sexual conduct or images of intimate body parts. (SENATE BILL 500, LEYVA)

**CALWORKS MODIFICATIONS**: Authorizes domestic violence survivors who are recipients of California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) benefits to be eligible for CalWORKs homeless assistance. (ASSEMBLY BILL 557, RUBIO)

**FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS' RESTROOMS**: Requires public schools serving students in grades six to 12 that meet the 40 percent pupil poverty threshold required to operate a federal Title I school wide program to always stock at least 50 percent of the school's restrooms with no-cost feminine hygiene products. (ASSEMBLY BILL 10, GARCIA)


