Our Tech Trek girls would like to keep in touch with each other, to continue their Tech Trek friendships and keep motivated about STEM. We can help them do that! We are starting out by planning an event for the girls to gather in person, socialize, learn about a STEM subject and keep in touch with our branch.

We would also like to take the girls on a tour of local STEM companies, showing them how they, too, can work in STEM fields someday. At each event we will tour one company, plus have time for travel to and from, socialization and maybe sharing snacks or a meal.

This 3,521 acre preserve contains a significant section of Santa Maria Creek— supporting a mosaic of sensitive habitats including grasslands, wetlands, vernal pools, coastal sage scrub and oak woodlands, along with hundreds of unique plant and animal species. AAUW-PP featured in Poway Living Magazine by Marie Dye

Our branch is being featured in the November issue of Poway Living magazine, which is distributed to residents of north Poway, approximately 3500 homes. Here is an excerpt of the article:

Happy Birthday, AAUW! Celebrating 50-110-140 years of advocating for women and girls

The year 2021 is a big one for the American Association of University Women (AAUW). The national organization was founded in 1881 - 140 years ago - as the nation's leading non-profit organization advocating equity for women and girls and currently 170,000 members strong. In 1921 - 110 years ago - AAUW California was established in San Francisco and boasts nearly 13,000 members in 140 branches, including the Poway-Peñasquitos branch, which was chartered in 1971. Hence, its 50th birthday this year!

Activities for advancements

The branch has over 100 members who are active and/or retired women professionals from Poway, Rancho Peñasquitos, Rancho Bernardo, Escondido, Carmel Valley and Scripps Ranch. President Cathy Burciaga says they spearhead several projects locally to support the organization's mission, including fundraising for scholarships for area women returning to college, sending middle school girls to Tech Trek math/science camp every year, and hosting an annual local speech competition for California high school students. "All the work we do goes right back into the community," Cathy notes.

Tech Trek is a particularly impactful program. "It's a wonderful week-long program at University California San Diego (pre-COVID) for 7th grade girls. It's a way to catch girls at a very vulnerable stage in their life when they start to veer away from math and science to pursue other interests like boys," explains Cathy. Through an interview process, girls nominated by their teachers are chosen on merit and need. "We target girls who wouldn't have a hope of ever getting into the fields of math and science." The camp exposes girls to various careers in science and women who are successful in their field, from astronauts to deep sea divers. "These women talk with the girls about all the opportunities available to them and how they can get started. The girls come away completely changed after the week."

Two other programs that promote equity among women are StartSmart and WorkSmart. "Research shows that within seven months of graduating college, women with identical degrees to men are already earning less money," explains Cathy. "They don't know how to negotiate. StartSmart teaches new graduating students how to negotiate for better salaries." Similarly, WorkSmart is an online workplace program that teaches employees how to negotiate for better pay. "This program also lends support and encouragement to these employees in their quest for better education and career advancement."

"We also host an annual authors' luncheon fundraiser called Cover to Cover that attracts prominent authors," adds Marie Dye, the branch's publicity chair. The event is planned for May 21st next year. "It's open to the public, so we encourage anyone who's interested to attend."

Doing good work, having a good time

Members meet on the second Wednesday of the month in the evenings, typically at the RB Swim & Tennis Club. But there are many other opportunities for members to gather for shared interests and experiences.

Updates from AAUW California Public Policy Committee by by

Abortion Justice

Although the constitutionally guaranteed right to an abortion has been systematically under attack for decades, it is currently in danger of disappearing altogether. As AAUW National recently noted, "Every person should have the ability to make their own informed decisions regarding their reproductive life. It is beyond time for abortion to be secured legally, funded fully, and equitably available for all who need it, when they need it, without shame or stigma." With the recent refusal of the U.S. Supreme Court to intervene in the onerous Texas case, it is clear that we can no longer count on the courts to protect this critical right. Congress must pass the Women's Health Protection Act. Watch for Action Alerts from National, use them to keep pressure on your representatives, and sign-up now for the 2-Minute Activist if you haven't already done so by clicking here <https://www.aauw.org/act/two-minute-activist/>.

Legislative Updates

Our last five priority bills that were awaiting the Governor's signature have been acted on and here are the results:

SB 62 (requires fair pay, instead of "by the piece" payment, for garment workers)

SIGNED

AB 367 (free menstrual products must be provided in girls/women's bathrooms in schools) SIGNED

AB 887 (allows domestic violence restraining orders to be filed electronically)

SIGNED

AB 123 (increases paid family leave benefits to 65 – 75% of regular pay)

VETOED

AB 1074 (requires hotel and janitorial workers who have lost their jobs due the pandemic to be prioritized for hiring as businesses reopen) VETOED

Economic Equity

October 21st is Latina Equal Pay Day – the day Latina women, who are paid just 57 cents to every white male's dollar, finally catch up from the previous year. To help raise awareness, our coalition partner Stronger California is hosting a Latina Equal Pay Day & Essential Women Workers Virtual Summit.
