We invited the campers, with a parent, to come to our September 9 meeting and five girls were able to attend. Three girls from the Rancho Bernardo Branch also attended this meeting, since our two branches have now become one affiliate.

The girls were eager to meet each other and share camp stories at their table. They wore their Tech Trek T-shirts, and we took a group photo of them to provide to the media. Each camper gave a short description of their camp experience, and we learned that one of the highlights of the camp this year was learning to solder!


Help AAUW Support Bills for Sexual

Assembly Bill 933, one of the bills on AAUW California's support list, is a beacon of hope for survivors of sexual assault, harassment, and discrimination.

In the wake of the MeToo movement, we've seen an unsettling rise in legal threats and intimidation against survivors. AB933 pushes back. It ensures that survivors have adequate protections against retaliatory and baseless defamation lawsuits and are entitled to relief in the form of reasonable attorney fees and damages for prevailing against baseless lawsuits.
