A grateful word of thanks for the donations we have received towards our Fall Campaign.

36 of our members have donated \$4800 to the Scholarship and Speech Trek Fund that is managed by our affiliate. Our commitment for these projects totals \$10,000 annually.

31 of our members have donated \$4000 to the Tech Trek Fund managed by the State officers to send 7th grade students to the Tech Trek Summer camps. Making Year-End Contributions: A Guide for Affiliates

As we approach the year-end giving season, we want to ensure that every affiliate understands the various methods available to them for making contributions. We've outlined three efficient and secure ways for you to send your donations to the national office.

- 1. Online Donations via the Community Hub: One of the simplest ways to contribute is directly through our Community Hub. So long as you are making donations to the AAUW Greatest Needs Fund you can make use of the Renewals and Donations function to contribute on behalf of your members. Just fill in the donation amount by member without clicking anything related to renewing to process just those contributions. If you would like to donate on behalf of your affiliate or to other funds, however, consider one of the other two options.
- 2. **Express Payment Link**: If you prefer a more direct approach, consider using an Express Payment Link. This method doesn't even require you to be logged in! Simply provide the national staff with the donor's name, donation amount, and the desired fund, and they will create an order on your behalf. Following this, you'll receive a link to finalize the transaction with your branch's preferred payment method. This method will allow you to donate on behalf of your branch, to other funds besides Greatest Needs, and for multiple people. Email connect@aauw.org with 'Express Payment Link' in the subject for assistance.

Individual Retirement Account (IRA) - For members thinking of making a year-end contribution from their IRA. Federal law allows people aged 70 1/2 or older to make direct transfers up to \$100,000 per year per person to charitable organizations from their IRA, without the withdrawal being treated as taxable income. To start, first contact your IRA custodian and follow their procedures to request a "Qualified Charitable Distribution." The check sent must be accompanied by your name and address information in order for you to receive a written acknowledgement from National. Please provide the recipient information below to your custodian, along with our Tax ID #52-6037388. Before sending, please also notify us at planned-giving@aauw.org so we can keep an eye out for your gift and be sure to include the amount, your name, address, the designation of your gift (for example: Greatest Needs), and the financial institution sending your gift. AAUW Policy & Member Advocacy (submitted by Janice Heather)

Last month, Harvard University economics professor Claudia Goldin, Ph.D., was awarded the Nobel Prize in economic sciences for her extensive research on gender differences in earnings (and she is only the 3rd woman to ever achieve this honor). As Dr. Goldin's research has shown, progress on closing the gender pay gap is stubborn and uneven. For example, Native American women have one of the largest wage gaps in the country, earning only 55 cents per dollar paid to the average white man.

Dr. Goldin's work focuses on long-term change, and we stand with her in the ongoing fight to ensure all women receive equal pay for equal work. We invite you to celebrate Professor Goldin's outstanding achievement by joining our continued fight for gender equity.

 robust public-school curriculum that is accessible to all and teaches historically accurate information?" This
 fund provides prizes to the top three speakers in the annual affiliate competition.
- Tech Trek Program This fund enables our affiliate to send seventh grade students from local middle schools to
 a one-week sleep away camp at UCSD. The focus of the camp is STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and
 Math).

Each of these programs supports and encourages students to reach for the stars. If you would like more information on any of these programs, please don't hesitate to ask any of the board members.

All donations to Re-entry Scholarships and Speech Trek are retained and managed by the affiliate through our fundraising account. Tech Trek donations are sent to AAUW-CA and are maintained in our escrow account to support students selected for Tech Trek by the affiliate. The donations to Tech Trek are tax deductible
