Welcome to the AAUW Poway Penasquitos Fall Fundraising Campaign for fiscal year 2024. Our membership is always very generous in donating to our key causes, Re-entry Scholarships, Speech Trek, Tech Trek, which support students in their educational pursuits.

In prior years our membership has generously supported AAUW Funds, which enables AAUW National to provide leadership. This year the Board has decided not to include AAUW-Funds in our Fall Campaign. We suggest you continue to give to AAUW Funds throughout the year

This year we are focusing our fundraising efforts to support the affiliate programs below:

- Re-Entry Scholarship Program— This fund provides scholarships to students re-entering community college or a four-year college/university.
- Speech Trek Program This is an AAUW-CA sponsored competition for high-school students. AAUW-CA selects a
 topic, the applicants prepare and present a five-to-six-minute speech in support of the topic. The topic for the
 2024 competition is: "If an educated population is essential to a nation's prosperity, then how can we ensure a
 robust public-school curriculum that is accessible to all and teaches historically accurate information?" This
 fund provides prizes to the top three speakers in the annual affiliate competition.
- Tech Trek Program This fund enables our affiliate to send seventh grade students from local middle schools to
 a one-week sleep away camp at UCSD. The focus of the camp is STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and
 Math).

Each of these programs supports and encourages students to reach for the stars. If you would like more information on any of these programs, please don't hesitate to ask any of the board members.

All donations to Re-entry Scholarships and Speech Trek are retained and managed by the affiliate through our fundraising account. Tech Trek donations are sent to AAUW-CA and are maintained in our escrow account to support students selected for Tech Trek by the affiliate. The donations to Tech Trek are tax deductible
