Did You Know? Notable Women in History by Joie Nolasco

Canadian born Sarah Emma Edmonds Seelye (her married name) worked as a spy and nurse after enlisting in the Union army disguised as a man and calling herself Franklin Thompson. In 1886 and again in 1889, Sarah became the first and only woman to be recognized as a veteran of the Civil War with an honorable discharge and to receive a pension and back pay for her service.
