November 13 General Meeting - Domestic Violence/Rape Prevention by Debbie Boyd and Karen McGurk

Domestic violence and rape are NOT pleasant topics to discuss and yet one in four women experience domestic violence in her lifetime. Crystal Lopez, currently the Volunteer Coordinator at the Women's Resource Center (WRC), will discuss safety planning and violence prevention as well as inform us about the services provided by the WRC at the General Meeting on Wednesday, November 13 from 1-3 p.m. The meeting will be held at the RB Eastview Community Center; 17520 Drayton Hall Way, San Diego 92128.

The Women's Resource Center of Oceanside has been sheltering survivors of domestic violence since 1974. They provide counseling services to women and their children, as well as transitional living housing for survivors of domestic violence. The WRC also operates a Thrift Store to generate revenue for the Center. (3385 Mission Ave. Oceanside, CA 92054, 760-757-3500 x8823)

Voter registration deadline

If you missed the voter registration deadline, you can still conditionally register and vote by visiting the Registrar of Voters or any Vote Center from Oct. 26 through Nov. 5.
