The First Ladies Exhibit at the National Museum of American History explores the unofficial but important position of First Lady and the ways that different women have shaped the role to make their own



contributions to the presidential administrations and the nation. <u>The First Ladies | National Museum of American History</u> (photo: Martha Washington's gown on display in the First Ladies' Gallery) Joie's interest in the First Ladies was sparked by a visit to the **National First Ladies Library & Museum** at 205 S. Market Ave., Canton, Ohio 44702. Be sure to delve into the museum's website, which is full of fascinating information: https://firstladies.org/

Starting with Martha Washington even the title of the role was unknown, going from Mrs. President, Ladyship, and many other terms before finally settling on First Lady.

There have been 57 First Ladies and not all of them have been spouses of the presidents. For example, Rose Cleveland, Grover Cleveland's sister, served as First Lady until he got married while in office. Also, John Tyler and Woodrow Wilson each had two First Ladies, as their wives died while they were in office, and they remarried. Finally, First Ladies do NOT receive a salary for the many jobs they do! Would you want this job?

Their lives mirror the nation's political and social growth, and the museum has organized the First Ladies into six categories based on the type of work they undertook. Here are just a few of the ladies listed in each category:

- Director of Social Affairs: Martha Washington, Dolley Madison, Julia Tyler, Sarah Polk.
- Symbols of Strength: Eliza Johnson, Lucretia Garfield, Barbara and Laura Bush.
- Policy Advocates: Abigail Adams and Hillary Clinton. Note: Not all first ladies were successful in their efforts, for example, Abigail Fillmore urged Millard to veto the Fugitive Slave Bill or risk losing the northern Whig Party base.
- Social Reformer: Eleanor Roosevelt, Lady Bird Johnson, Betty Ford, Michelle Obama.
- Keeper of "The People's House": Edith Roosevelt, Jacqueline Kennedy, Pat Nixon, Melania Trump.
- Presidential Partner: Ida McKinley, Bess Truman, Frances Cleveland, Mamie Eisenhower.
